ECOTOUR

1 - MEDINA AZAHARA

The Caliphate City was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site on 1 July 2018. This archaeological site corresponds to a newly founded city built in the mid-10th century as the seat of the Caliphate of Córdoba by the western Umayyad dynasty. It has a complete urban complex, with buildings, decoration and everyday objects, which provides an incredible insight into the material culture of a civilisation that has disappeared. It should be noted that it is the only preserved site of its kind in Europe.



2 - HISTORIC CENTER

The old city center is declared Human Heritage. You may walk down the Calleja de las Flores, through the Plaza de la Corredera, among the narrow streets of the Jewish quarter, take in the Synagogue, the Viana Palace or the Roman bridge and temple, visit the Alcázar de los Reyes Cristianos and its gardens... The city is an example of century-long co-inhabitation.



3 - MOSQUE OF CORDOBA

Known locally as Mezquita-Catedral, the Great Mosque of Córdoba is one of the oldest structures still standing from the time Muslims ruled Al-Andalus. The Mosque was consecrated as a Christian Cathedral in the same year that Córdoba was reconquered (1236).



4 - FESTIVAL OF THE COURTYARDS

This is the city's most international festival and takes place every May. During the festival the patios of the Historic Centre of Córdoba are open to the public. These patios are decorated with flowers which fill the city with colour and aromas of jasmine and orange blossom.

ECOTOUR

1 - "CLÉRIGOS" TOWER

One of the symbols of the city is the Clérigos Tower, designed by the Italian architect Nicolau Nasoni in the mid-1700s, from the top of which you have a panoramic view over the historic city centre.



2 - SÃO BENTO TRAIN STATION

Completed in 1903, São Bento is one of the world's most beautiful train stations: mansard roof, imposing facade and dramatic tile panels ("azulejos") of historic scenes in the from hall.



3 - PORTO CATHEDRAL - SÉ CATEDRAL

Rising high and mighty above Porto's tangle of medieval alleys and stairways, you can find the fortress like cathedral, founded in the 12th century, where history reverberates in its Romanesque-meets-baroque nave and cloister.



4 - BRIDGE DOM LUÍS

From the double-decker arched bridge, opened in 1886, you can have a spectacular leap over the Douro river and the Ribeira wharf.



5 - RIBEIRA WHARF / CAIS DA RIBEIRA

The Ribeira wharf is Porto of a million postcards: the Ribeira's chalk-hued houses rising behind you, the Douro river unfurling before you, colourfull street entertainers and the typical "rabelo" boats rocking in the waters of the Douro river.

ECOTOUR



1 - TRULLO SIAMESE

Its peculiarity lies in the double shape of the roof: a continuous double cone. The recess between the two cones was filled, or 'insellata', by the master "trullaro" who built the building. The Siamese trullo has two entrances, one for each trullo, facing two different streets.



2 - SANT'ANTONIO CHURCH

It is a Greek cross-shaped church located at the top of the Monti district, unique in its kind because it is entirely made of trulli. Its construction is quite recent, in fact it was built in 1927.



4 - PIAZZA CHIESA DEI SS. MEDICI

Characteristic are the two bell towers of the Minor Basilica dedicated to the patron saints of the city, Saints Cosmas and Damian. The monument is one of the most important in the city.



3 - PIAZZA GIAN GIROLAMO-FONTANA DEL BELVEDERE

Piazza Gian Girolamo is in the historic centre of Alberobello, with its fountain and close to the Aia Piccola district; a few steps away is the famous Belvedere, which enjoys a wide view from the Piazza del Comune to the Monti district.



5 - TRULLO SOVRANO

The Trullo Sovrano is located in the northern part of Alberobello, behind the Church of Santi Medici Cosma e Damiano. It represents the only trullo to have a raised floor, reachable from the inside through a masonry staircase, among the first to be built with mortar.

1 - PLAKA DISTRICT

Plaka is a district in the center of Athens below the Acropolis. Is one of the few districts of the city - if not the only one - that has been continuously inhabited since antiquity and was, among other things, the center of Ancient Athens.

2 - THE CONSERVATORY OF HEROD OF ATTICUS

More widely known as Herodion, is an ancient conservatory of the Roman period located on the southwestern slope of the Acropolis of Athens.



4 - THE ACROPOLIS MUSEUM

The Acropolis Museum is an archaeological museum focused on the findings of the archaeological site of the Acropolis of Athens. The new building of the museum opened to the public on 2009.



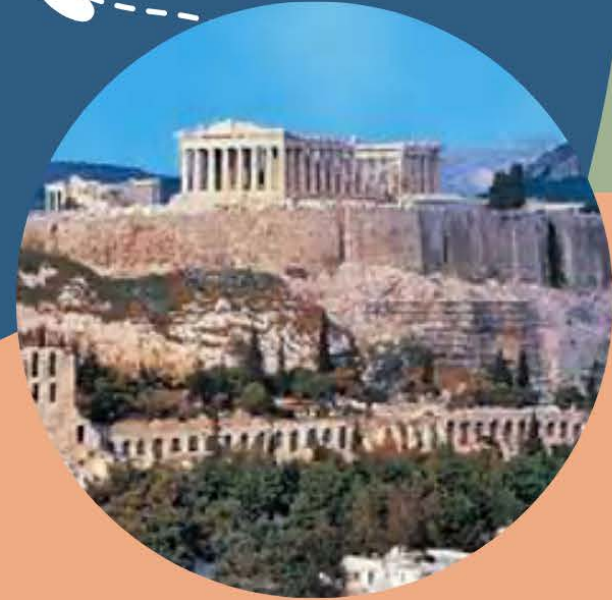
3 - THE THEATER OF DIONYSOS

Is the most important known outdoor theater in ancient Athens and is considered the first theater in the world and was probably founded in the 6th BC. century, in the period of the Peisistratid dynasty.



5 - THE ROCKY HILL OF THE ACROPOLIS

On the rocky hill of the Acropolis founded the 5th B.C., which dominates the center of modern Athens, was the most important and majestic sanctuary of the ancient city, dedicated, primarily, to its patron goddess, Athena.

ECOTOUR

1 - THE OLD CITY WALLS

The old city walls of Dubrovnik are one of its best-known features. Built in the 10th century and modified in the 13th and 14th centuries, these formidable walls—as high as six meters in places, and up to six meters thick—provided a solid defense against invaders.



2 - STRADUM

The spectacular Stradun – also known as Placa – is a place where locals and visitors alike gather day and night to watch the world drift by. Undoubtedly one of Europe's most picturesque pedestrian thoroughfares.



4 - THE CITY GATES

Dubrovnik's famous Pile Gate has served as the main entrance and is still the most interesting access point to this fabulous old city.



5 - LOVRIJENAC FORTRESS

The Fort Lovrijenac—also known as St. Lawrence Fortress—has long been one of Croatia's most important fortresses.



3 - DUBROVNIK CATHEDRAL

The beautiful Dubrovnik Cathedral—also referred to as the Assumption Cathedral (its full name is the Cathedral of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary, or Katedrala Velike Gospe in Croatian)—was designed in Baroque style by Andrea Buffalini of Rome.
