






4. What is bullying?





49,4% believe than bullying is an aggressive behavior, a reproduction of embarrassing information and a repetitive behavior. **32,7%** believe that bullying is only an aggressive behavior, **9,3%** that it is only a reproduction of embarrassing information and **8,5%** that it is only a repetitive behavior.

5. What is the most dangerous type of violence according to you? 706 responses




44,1% believe that the most dangerous type of violence is the physical one, **22,8%** the emotional one, **12,6%** the cyberbullying and only **3,5%** the economic one.





In the question whether the students have ever committed any acts of violence small or serious, **70%** answer negatively.


7. How frequently does manifestation of violence occur in your school among students? 706 responses



42,8% believe that once a year or less manifestation of violence occurs in their school, **31,9%** believe that occurs more than once a month, **13,3%** more than once a week and only **12%** every day.

8. How can school tackle violent acts? (more than 1 answer)



48,9% support that school can tackle violent acts by maintaining good relationships, **39,8%** by cultivation of social skills, **44,9%** by having a Mediation Room and **43,1%** by managing anger. Other ideas that students mention: by taking part in activities related to reducing violence, by organizing "stop to violence day", by learning how to express their emotions, by creating space where all the students are together or extracurricular activities where students can have fun.

9. Have you ever been the victim of a violent event?



In the question whether the students have ever been the victim of a violent event **63,9%** answer negatively.

10. If you were a victim of a violent event, you ..



If they were a victim of a violent event **68,4%** answer that they would report it to a teacher or an adult, **22%** answer that they would take revenge on the perpetrator, **14,7%** would keep silent, **12,3%** would break out in whoever they find in front of them and **8,8%** would be afraid.

11. Do you think violence always occurs because of provocation?



12. Would you be violent with someone if you were provoked?



13. Do you think that strong people are the ones that generally commit violent action against weaker ones?



14. What is the most common type of violence that occurs at your school?



15. Do you feel safe at your school?



17. If you witness a violent event in school you ..



In the question if they witness a violent event, what they would do, **45,3%** would report it to a teacher, **23,7%** would try to stop it, **13,7%** would get in the middle to separate the actors, **9,3%** would just observe it, **4,7%** would do nothing and run away and **3,3%** would encourage it.

18. Victims of violent events should report them.....first.



60,5% believe that victims of violent events should report it to their families first, **28,5%** to their teachers and **11%** to the police.


19. Which of the following leads to violence at schools the most?





43,5% feel that peer pressure (treatment, fashion, reputation) leads to violence at schools, **41,4**% feel that parental negligence (abuse, neglect, divorce, conflicting relationships), **15,2**% feel that entertainment (videogames, movies, book, art).

20. Do you think violence can be prevented with a proper education at schools? 706 responses




40,4% think that violence can be prevented with proper education at schools, **39,2%** maybe and **20,4%** answer negatively.





41,8% believe that they can manage their anger by eliminating toxic emotions, **31,9%** by cultivating empathy, **31,6%** by isolating themselves, **35,4%** by listening to different aspects, **17,19%** by insisting on their side of the story.



58% strongly believe that the project will contribute to the reduction of violent acts in school.
